How to Properly Recycle and Dispose of Garbage

Disposal Methods

Please drop off your garbage at the collection point by 8:30 a.m. on the collection day.

(Do not put it out on the day before.)

Notes on bringing garbage directly to the sanitation center

- (1) You can only bring in garbage on weekdays (closed for the End of the year and New Year holidays) and once a month on a specified Sunday or public holiday
- (2) Garbage is weighed according to type, so please sort it before bringing it to the center.
- (3) Please confirm opening hours and other details via the contacts below.

Burnable Garbage

Disposal Methods

- (1)Please use bags designated for burnable garbage (labeled with red text) or garbage disposal tickets (for newspapers, magazines, cardboard, and leafy branches).
- (2)Make sure recyclable and non-burnable items are not mixed

(3)Please remove as much moisture from food waste as possible.

(4)Wrap items that could cause injury such as bamboo skewers in paper or something similar.

(5)Soak up cooking oil with paper or cloth, or solidify it before disposal.



- (1)Please use bags designated for non-burnable garbage (labeled with black text).
- (2)Make sure recyclable and burnable items are not mixed.
- (3)Non-burnable items too large to fit in the bags need to be disposed of as bulky waste
- (4)Wrap hazardous items such as knives or broken glass, in paper or something similar, and clearly label the contents.

Non-burnable Garbage

- (5)Do not break fluorescent bulbs before disposal.(It is alright if they protrude from the non-burnable garbage bag) (6) The contents of gas canisters and spray cans must be fully emptied. Puncture canisters and cans before disposal.
- (7)Wrap batteries with cellophane tape, then place them in a plastic bag or similar. Clearly label as "Batteries."(Do not use designated non-burnable garbage bags for the disposal of batteries.)



Watch batteries and rechargeable batteries cannot be disposed of with regular garbage.

Bulk Waste

Furniture, etc., that does not fit in the designated garbage bags

Bulky waste cannot be disposed of at garbage collection points.

Disposal of tatami mats is limited to 20 a day per household

(Methods of Dispose) Please bring bulky waste directly

to the sanitation

center or request collection from one of the centers listed below.

(Sanitation centers can collect your items at a scheduled date and time for a fee.)



Non-collectible Waste

•Waste from moving Business-generated waste

Businesses like stores, restaurants, and offices need to either properly dispose of waste generated from commercial activity themselves, or contact a licensed waste collection and transportation service.



Non-processable Waste

Six recyclable home appliances



Items TVs, refrigerators, freezers, air

Disposal Methods Contact the store you purchased the item from or a specialized disposal company.

Recycling computers



Items Computers

Disposal Methods Contact the store you purchased the computer from or its manufacturer.

Other non-processable waste

Items Agricultural equipment (farm tools, agricultural plastic, pesticides, pesticide containers, seedling trays, greenhouse poles, etc.), chemical products, fire extinguishers, concrete blocks, tiles, petroleum products and waste oils, automotive and motorcycle parts (tires, batteries, bumpers, etc.), construction waste, medical waste, religious objects, etc.

Disposal Methods Contact the store you purchased the item from or a specialized disposal company.



(3)Dispose of any metal caps separately with other metal containers and cans.

(4)If the glass is broken, wrap it in paper or something similar. (5)Dispose of glass containers and bottles with residue or oil in them and tempered glass items as non-burnable garbage.

(2) Rinse out the inside of the container or can.

(3)Do not crush metal containers or cans.

(4)Dispose of metal containers and cans with residue or oil in them as non-burnable garbage.

(2)Cut the cartons open and tie them in a stack with a string so that it crosses on each side

Preparing for Disposal Dry paper waste that is free of non-paper materials like nylon

Examples: Newspapers, advertising flyers, books, cardboard, paper containers and packaging, copy paper, envelopes (with the plastic part removed), calendars, notebooks, posters, postcards, business cards, etc.



Preparing for Disposal

Plastic containers and packaging with this recycling symbols

Disposal Methods

- (1)Please use bags designated for plastic containers and packaging (labeled with purple text).
- (2) If items are dirty, rinse them lightly with water or wipe them clean.
- (3)Contents of these designated bags will be sorted, so please do not place items in another plastic bag before placing them in the designated bags.
- (4)Dispose of containers and packaging with residue or oil on them as burnable garbage

Preparing for Disposal



Food or drink plastic PET bottles with this recycling symbols

Disposal Methods

- (1)Please use bags designated for plastic PET bottles (labeled with yellow text)
- (2)Remove and dispose of labels and caps separately with other plastic containers and packaging
- (3) Rinse out the inside of the bottle.
- (4) Do not crush bottles.
- (5)Dispose of plastic PET bottles with residue or oil in them as burnable garbage



Disposal Methods

- (1)Dispose of different kinds of waste paper separately. Lay items out flat (fold as needed), stack neatly, then tie with string so that it crosses on both sides.
- (2)Newspapers, magazines, and cardboard brought to the garbage collection point are considered burnable garbage and need to have a garbage disposal ticket attached.
- (3)Dispose of thermal paper, waterproof paper, and wax-coated cardboard as burnable garbage

Non-recyclable Waste				
Burnable garbage	This refers to waste that is not recyclable, but that can be incinerated. Examples: Clothing, audio and other recording media (videotapes, CDs, DVDs, floppy disks, MiniDiscs), rigid plastic products (buckets, office items, toys), disposable heat packs, leather products (with metal removed), desiccants, drying agents, food waste, disposable diapers (with solid waste removed), footwear (leather shoes, boots, sneakers, sandals), paper and plastic products without recycling logos, or items with recycling logos that are too dirty to recycle.		Large bags: 500 yen per bag (set of 10) Small bags: 300 yen per bag (set of 10)	
Burnable garbage (garbage disposal tickets)	 Examples: Items not accepted at recycling points or sanitation centers including newspapers, magazines, cardboard, and leafy branches. Newspapers and magazines: Stack up to 30 cm high and tie with string so that it crosses on both sides. Cardboard: Fold up to a size of 50 cm by 60 cm with a thickness of up to 20 cm, and tie with string so that it crosses on both sides. Leafy branches: Branches can each be up to 50 cm long and 10 cm in diameter. (If you bring leafy branches directly to the sanitation center, each branch can be up to 100 cm long and 10 cm in diameter. 	Collection is twice a week on designated days.	Garbage disposal ticket: 300 yen per bundle (set of 10)	
Non-burnable garbage	 This refers to waste like metal and ceramics that is neither recyclable nor burnable. Examples: Cooking utensils (frying pans, pots, kettles, knives), tableware (plates, bowls, cups), small electrical appliances (rice cookers, electric kettles, irons, audio equipment), gardening supplies (wire, saws, shovels, flower pots, screwdrivers), daily necessities (mirrors, light fixtures), and spray cans (please puncture and release any gas). 	Collection is once a month on a designated day.	Large bags: 500 yen per bag (set of 10) Small bags: 300 yen per bag (set of 10)	
Recyclable Waste				
Glass containers/bottles	This refers only to glass food containers or drink bottles. If the glass is broken, wrap it in paper or something similar. Examples: Liquor bottles (whiskey, shochu, wine) and food containers (jam, coffee, preserved foods, vinegar, soy sauce, sweets).	Collection is once a month on a designated day.	250 yen per bag (set of 10)	
Metal containers/cans	This refers only to aluminum or steel food containers or drink cans with a recycling logo.Examples: Cans and canisters for juice, beer, sweets, or dried foods, and metal caps from bottles.Recycling Marker:AluminumThe steel	Collection is once a month on a designated day.		
Plastic containers and packaging	 This refers only to product containers and packaging with a plastic recycling logo. Examples: Containers and packaging for sweets, bento lunches, and instant noodles; trays for fresh food; caps and labels from plastic PET bottles; egg cartons; bags for clothing, food, and general goods; bottles and tubes for condiments and detergents; container caps and lids; protective and stabilizing packing materials; and styrofoam. Plastic PET bottles	This refers only to plastic PET bottles for food or drinks with a recycling logo. Examples: Plastic PET bottles used for soft drinks, alcoholic beverages, and condiments. Recycling Marker: PET PET	and packaging, plastic PET bottles, and paper cartons are collected on the same day.)		
Waste paper cartons	This refers only to paper cartons with white interiors. Examples: Milk cartons and juice cartons. (Cartons with foil interiors should be disposed of as burnable garbage.)		Free	
Newspapers, magazines, cardboard, paper containers and packaging	 This refers to paper that is free of non-paper materials like nylon. Examples: Newspapers, advertising flyers, comic books, books, cardboard, paper containers and packaging (boxes with recycling logos for cookies, cigarettes, tissues, or gifts), copy paper, posters, postcards, catalogs, notebooks, business cards, pamphlets, envelopes (with the plastic part removed), and calendars.
